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In the course of providing educational programming for the students of Miami-Yoder School District, the Board of Education encourages students to take advantage of educational opportunities, offered by other cooperative institutions, including colleges, universities and vocational schools. The following stipulations apply for students electing to attend such institutions:

Post-Secondary Educational Options: For those students seeking an Associates or Bachelors degree, applicants must:

- Be in their junior (11<sup>th</sup> grade) or senior (12<sup>th</sup> grade) year,
- Provide the district with \$300.00 deposit in the form of check, money order, or cashier's check
- Juniors must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.40 in all core subjects (math, English, social studies, and science).
- Seniors must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.00 in all core subjects (math, English, social studies, and science).
- Juniors applying for the program during the Spring of their sophomore (10<sup>th</sup> grade year), must have scored proficient on the 9<sup>th</sup> grade reading, writing, and mathematics CSAP test, and if available, have scored a minimum of 19 on the Colorado ACT, and have passed the ACCU-PLACER exam given by the institution of higher education. In addition, the student must present the principal with two letters of recommendation from teachers in the core areas (high school), recommending attendance.
- Seniors applying for the program during the Spring of their junior (11<sup>th</sup> grade year), must have scored proficient on the 10<sup>th</sup> grade reading, writing, and science CSAP test and must have scored a minimum of "high partially proficient" on the 10<sup>th</sup> grade math CSAP test. If available, the student must have scored a minimum of 17 on the Colorado ACT, and have passed the ACCU-PLACER exam given by the institution of higher education. In addition, the student must present the principal with two letters of recommendation from teachers in the core areas (high school), recommending attendance.
- Have written permission from parents/guardians and complete a signed contract stipulating to the conditions of attendance and possible financial requirements.
- Submit an application to the secondary principal, no later than February 15<sup>th</sup> of the school year for fall attendance and October 15<sup>th</sup>, for spring attendance.
